What is “college ready?”

Being college ready means being ready for any postsecondary experience, including two and four year institutions leading to a postsecondary credential like a certificate, license, Associate’s or Bachelor’s degree. Being academically ready for college means that a high school graduate has the English and Math knowledge and skills to qualify for and succeed in entry-level, credit bearing college coursework without the need for remedial coursework.

What is “career ready?”

Being career ready means that a high school graduate has the English and Math knowledge and skills needed to qualify for and succeed in the postsecondary job training and/or education necessary for their chosen career. Technical/vocational programs, community college, and significant on-the-job training are examples.
